RULES AND REGULATIONS

Entries

All *equestrian entries* to be made in writing or online, before 10pm on Friday 12th February 2021.

All other entries can be made online, or when exhibits are brought to the show.

Pavilion exhibits may be brought to the Pavilion from 2-7pm Friday before Show Day & 8-9am on Show Day.

Sheep and wool for competition must be brought to the yards or Wool Room before 9am. All stock exhibited must be bona fide property of the exhibitor or exhibitor's principal for not less than one month prior to the Show.

Gates will be open to the *public* at 9am.

Equestrian

The use of tranquillisers, stimulants, or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses and ponies is forbidden. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk.

All horses must be haltered and led.

With reference to entries in classes of this Show, *local* shall be defined as *exhibitors or competitors who reside in Dunrobin, Raes Junction, Gorge Creek and Teviot Area for a minimum of 60 days prior to show date*. Riders may only compete at one show as a local.

Exhibitors are specially requested to forward their entries *as early as possible*, and thus facilitate the preparation of the Show catalogue. No entry fees will be refunded upon withdrawal of entries unless written application, giving satisfactory reasons for such withdrawals, is received by the Secretary not later than 24 hours before the Show.

Pavilion

Judging commences 9.45am. Hall opens to public 1pm to 4pm.

The public will be excluded from Pavilion, and doors locked at 4pm to allow exhibitors to take away exhibits, from 4.15pm to 4.30pm

No person to make any drawing of Stock or Machinery without the consent of the owner, obtained through the Secretary

Any prize awarded shall lapse if not applied for within three months from date of award.

Livestock

No animal or any flock with regard to which there may be a suspicion of disease will be knowingly received at the yard, and owners will, if necessary, be required to make a declaration as to whether their flocks have been diseased, within 60 days prior to the date of the Show.

Prizes and Trophies

List of Special Prizes and Trophies will be listed in Catalogue.

The committee reserves the right to allot Specials in lieu of prize money mentioned in this Programme Cups, unless won outright are held at the Show Grounds.

Show points system

Points to count: First 5 points; second 3 points; third 1 point. For equestrian jumping classes, points will be awarded: First 12 points; second 8 points; third 4 points. In the event of a tie for any cup, the winner of the greatest number of first prizes takes precedence.

There are no points awarded for Special classes.

General

All protests must be made in writing, with a deposit of \$10, and left with the Secretary within two hours of the prize tickets being affixed to the exhibits, and the Committee, whose decision shall be final, will decide on same as soon as practicable. The deposit will be forfeited if the protest be not sustained.

There shall be no limitation of time for objection in a case of fraud or misrepresentation.

Any animal showing signs of maltreatment, by doctoring or otherwise, in order to gain a prize, will be disqualified.

The committee will not, under any circumstances, hold itself responsible for loss, damage or misdelivery of stock, implements or other articles exhibited or taken on to the Show Grounds.

Any exhibitor or any person in any way interfering with or using improper language to the Judges or any officer of the Society in or as to the execution of their duty, or being guilty of improper conduct on the Show Grounds, may be disqualified from exhibiting at future shows of the Society, and if an exhibitor, shall be liable to forfeit all prizes he may have won.

Should any person or firm deliberately infringe any of the Rules or Regulations of the Society, or refuse to comply with the request of the Committee, it shall have power to suspend such person or firm from exhibiting at the Annual Show during such term as it may think fit.

All persons admitted to the Show Grounds shall be subject to the Rules and Orders of the Committee and in the event of misbehaviour on the part of any person attending the Show, such person may be removed from the Showground by the Committee or any three members thereof.

All entries must comply with the Rules and Regulations.

In all events competitors compete at their own risk.

Late entry fee per competitor \$10.00. This also applies to class changes after the entry cutoff date. This show supports the RAS yellow card system.

No Horse or Pony under 3 years permitted to be shown under saddle

Ponies not eligible for Hack events.

Height Certificates and Performance Cards must be produced on request.

All riders must wear red tagged safety helmets at all times. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within the Showgrounds.

Riders in all Pony Classes and Competitions must be under 17 years of age, except where otherwise stated. Novice ponies may be ridden by an adult.

For classes of five or fewer entries, prize money will only be paid out for first place.

START 1.30PM, NORTH RING

A Novice is a pony/horse that has had 0-3 wins in Round the Ring jumping at an A&P Show. To enter classes 139 and 143, competitors must be a member of a Hunt, and have qualified over at least three hunts in the 2020 season. Qualification cards must be carried. Judging for Qualified Hunter classes will not be done as a separate event, but will be carried out concurrently with judging for Open and Novice classes. In Open classes the first round only will be counted for this.
